


Image and level of trust in the EU Optimism about the future of the EU

While **the positive image of the EU** remains stable at a high level, **trust in the EU** and **optimism about its future** have slightly increased since Autumn 2023.



The main concerns of Europeans

The war in Ukraine remains the most important concern at EU level, after a steep increase, followed by immigration, the international situation and inflation.












EXPECTATIONS REGARDING THE ECONOMIC SITUATION IN THE NEXT 12 MONTHS







EU policy actions and areas in the short and medium term

Respondents think that **ensuring peace and stability** is the action at EU level that would have the highest positive impact on their life in the next year. They also consider that security and defence is the most important area where the EU should take measures in the next five years.

EU response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine

Among the actions taken by the EU in response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, providing humanitarian support to the people affected by the war gets the highest percentage of agreement.



87% (-2pp) Providing humanitarian support to the people affected by the war



72% Imposing economic sanctions on Russian government, companies and individuals



60% (-1pp) Granting candidate status as a

potential Member of the EU



83% (-1pp) Welcoming into the EU people fleeing the war



70% (-2pp) Providing **financial** support to Ukraine



60% (=) Financing the purchase and supply of **military** equipment to Ukraine

Perceptions on European and national identity and citizenship

Most EU citizens see themselves as "National and European", and a third "National only". Close to three quarters feel they are a citizen of the EU.


